**Industrial Affiliates Program Agreement

In consideration of the mutual benefits to be derived through a closer relationship between Stanford University and SAMPLE DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION, Stanford University has extended to SAMPLE DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION the rights and privileges of membership in the Stanford Rock Physics and Borehole Geophysics Project (SRB).

In consideration, SAMPLE DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION will pay to Stanford University the sum of \$51,000 US for the calendar year of 2010. This agreement is considered renewed on an annual basis upon receipt of the annual membership fee from SAMPLE DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION.

The benefits of membership in the Stanford Rock Physics and Borehole Geophysics project affiliates program to be derived by SAMPLE DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION to include the following:

- An annual meeting with formal presentations by faculty and students on new and ongoing research, with opportunities for an informal exchange of ideas among industry representatives and Stanford University researchers.
- Advance electronic copies of research reports, papers and other publications originated by those faculty and students associated with the Stanford Rock Physics and Borehole Geophysics project, together with a directory of faculty/student research being done by those associated with the Rock Physics and Borehole Geophysics Project.
- Notice of workshops, seminars, and colloquia at Stanford University which would be of interest to SAMPLE DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION
- Assistance in arranging interviews between individual students and SAMPLE DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION representatives.

SAMPLE DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION acknowledges and agrees that this program is governed by Stanford's published policies on research and treatment of research results:

- Stanford University does not permit secrecy in research. All interested persons will have access to the underlying data, the processes and the results of research conducted at Stanford;
- Teaching and research at Stanford are guided by its faculty who select research topics, adopt research methodology, and select participants;

- No license or other intellectual property rights will be granted as a result of support for the program. Unless a sponsored research agreement supporting the project requires otherwise, Stanford researchers are free to place their inventions in the public domain.
